ID policy for 2019

Attendees are required to show a government-issued photo ID upon arrival at ExCeL London.

The official IDs that will be accepted are passport, driver's license or national identity card. Please make sure that you bring your photo ID with you to Sibos each day, as if you do not have an appropriate ID to accompany your Sibos badge you will not be granted access.

To help streamline security checks, please remember to keep your badge on, and visible, at all times and always carry your photo ID.

The Sibos smart badge

The Sibos smart badge is a badge fitted with a wearable tag that allows SWIFT to anonymously track your location and movements whilst at the ExCeL.



Key features:

- Enhances security by tracking number of people in each area.
- No badge scanning when you enter a conference room. You just need to have your badge scanned when entering the venue, and for any lead retrieval purposes when engaging with exhibitors.
- Captures aggregated demographic data that will inform improvements for future events.
- Exchange details with another delegate by clicking your badge. Simply hold your badges close to one another, click at the same time, and you will receive each other's contact details via email.

Sustainability initiatives

Traveling to Sibos impacts our environment; Sibos delegates can make a considerable difference by planting trees which are known for cooling our climate, bringing our water back and creating jobs to alleviate poverty.

This year, Sibos will fund 20 trees for each paying delegate. Delegates can also further contribute to the campaign by donating 10 euros, which will enable the planting of 7 additional trees. There is a tick box option in the online registration form for delegates who wish to add the 10 euros to their registration fee. SWIFT will also plant trees to compensate the travel of its employees to the event. Every tree counts, so let's grow a large forest together! Sibos is partnering with WeForest on this tree planting project. The trees will be planted in Ethiopia, supporting communities to regenerate their forest.

We're reducing our use of plastics with 100% biodegradable edible water capsules, paper badges and reusable water bottles. We're also inviting exhibitors to get involved with our Ecobooth scheme to recycle single-use stand materials to create community picnic benches. Transportation





This year all delegates with a weeklong Sibos pass will receive an Oyster Card prepaid with £40 on it. To get the best price for your journeys make sure you tap in at the barrier and then tap out when you arrive at your destination.



Where to get off:

There are two DLR stations for the London ExCeL

Custom House

This is the station for the West Entrance: mainly for non-badge holders though badge holders can use it as well as it is a 5-minute walk along the ExCeL boulevard.

Prince Regent

This is the station for the East entrance and is for badge holders. From the station it is a 2-minute walk to reach the Sibos entry gate

Getting to the ExCeL



From Heathrow

You can take the Heathrow Express to Paddington then change for the Jubilee Line to Canning Town. At Canning Town, change for the Beckton line on the Docklands Light Railway (DLR), you can get off at either Custom House (non-badge and badge holders) and Prince Regent (badge holders). Alternatively you can get the Piccadilly line from Heathrow terminals, connect to the Jubilee line and change at Canning Town for the DLR, Beckton Line.



From City Airport

Take the DLR to Canning town then change for the Beckton line you can get off at either Custom House (non-badge and badge holders) and Prince Regent (badge holders).



From the West End and City of London

From your hotel get on the nearest underground stop, doesn't really matter which line, head for Canning Town which is on the Jubilee line, once you are there, change for the DLR Beckton line, you can get off at either Custom House (non-badge and badge holders) and Prince Regent (badge holders).

Alternatively head for Tower Gate and get the DLR train straight to the ExCeL from there, Tower gate also has connections for the District and Circle lines.

Weather

September can be cool but not cold in London. The maximum high is 24c going down to about 7c at night. It is always a good idea to have an umbrella handy!

Time Zone

During Sibos, London is 1 hour behind Central European Time e.g. Frankfurt, Paris and Brussels.

NOTE: Time zone will be British summer time which is UTC +1

Tipping

Tipping is not customary, nor expected, but is welcome when the service exceeds expectation. It is recommended to tip 10% in bars and restaurants for good service.

Taxes



A Value Added Tax (VAT) of 20% is included in all consumer goods and services in Britain, which is included in the retail price advertised.



The currency in the UK is the Great Britain Pound (GBP)

- For denominations under five pounds, coins are used.
- You'll find cash machines/ ATMs all over the city and in most banks, hotels and shopping centres.
- Credit cards are accepted at all major retailers and in taxis
- Currency exchange is available at kiosks in the city and at airports.

Voltage



British electricity supply is 240 volts, 60 Hz. Appliance connection is via a flat 3-pin. If your appliance's plug doesn't match the shape of these sockets, you will need a travel plug adapter in order to connect.

Did you Know?

Five facts about London that are not commonly known.





Big Ben is not actually called Big Ben. Surprisingly, it is actually meant to go by the name 'The Clock Tower', while 'Big Ben' is actually the name of the bell. The Great Fire which devastated London in 1666 had a verified death toll of only six people. Meanwhile it reduced large parts of the city to ruins.



Feeding pigeons in Trafalgar Square is banned. Trafalgar Square was once renowned for housing thousands of feral pigeons, which tourists often fed or posed with. In 2003, London Mayor Ken Livingstone banned feeding them or selling feed near the square.



The Millennium Dome is the biggest structure of its kind in the world. It is so big, it can fit the Great Pyramids of Giza comfortably under its roof! The structure is 365m in diameter; 52m high in the middle; with 12 supporting poles, symbolising days, weeks and months of the year.



The London Eye was not the first big wheel in London. The Great Wheel was constructed in 1895 for the Empire of India Exhibition. It was then sadly demolished in 1907, 91 years before construction started on the London Eye.
